Leading the club is Steve Govett, who is the President and General Manager for the Colorado Mammoth. Coach Govett played both collegiately as well as professionally before running the Mammoth.

Alongside Coach Govett is Jamie Munro, current Head Coach for the University of Denver. Coach Munro has been the Head Coach for the NCAA Division I Denver Pioneers for the past 10 years and is a former All-American player at Brown University.

Other head coaches in our program are Dan Pratt, current defensive coach for the Colorado Mammoth and former All-American at Syracuse University, and Bill Hall, Assistant General Manager for the Colorado Mammoth and former Team Colorado Coach. Sara Munro, a former collegiate player at NCAA Division III Hamilton College and president of Run & Shoot Lacrosse, will be coaching and overseeing Blue Sky's girl's teams.
